Chair Rest and Members of the Senate Taxes Committee:

Metro Cities, representing the shared interests of cities across the metropolitan area at the Legislature and Executive Branch, appreciates the opportunity to comment on SF 4875 – Mitchell, a bill that requires metropolitan cities receiving local affordable housing aid, which is provided to first, second and third-class metropolitan cities, to maintain locally funded housing expenditures at a level not less than the average level of expenditures for the three preceding fiscal years.

Metro Cities respectfully opposes the proposed maintenance of effort requirement as proposed in SF 4875. This requirement would in effect impede the ability of city officials to account for local circumstances and needs that go into city budgeting and taxing processes.

Metro Cities is concerned that the proposed maintenance of effort requirement would undermine local decisions on fiscal issues and planned growth as well as the relationship between locally elected officials and their residents, by allowing the state to decide the appropriate level of local taxation and services, despite varying local conditions and circumstances.
