According to the 2022 USDA Census of Agriculture, there are 65,531 farms in Minnesota with 114,868 producers. With a total of 35,623 women producers, 31% of producers are women. This has remained a constant percentage in the last two Census of Agriculture surveys.

There are 3,270 women age 35 and under farming in Minnesota. There are a total of 11,274 young producers in Minnesota, so 29% of young farmers are women.

An interesting change in the data from 2017 to 2022 is the change in the number of female producers who have moved into farming as their primary occupation. The number of women who state their primary occupation is farming increased by 270 women farmers from the last census at 11,452.

Farming continues to grow and so do small farms. The number of farms with 10 to 49 acres grew from 4,365 farms in 2017 to 5,672 farms in 2022. Other statistics are that farms with 1 to 9 acres grew from 1,974 five years ago to 2,189 in 2022. Farms with 180 to 499 acres grew from 2,869 in 2017 to 3,149 farms in 2022. Farms with 500 acres or more grew from 2,183 in 2017 to 2,599 in 2022.

The average-sized farm in Minnesota is 388 acres in 2022, up from 371 in 2017.
