

Take Pride Act



(HF 1655/SF 1886)

Minnesota has a lot to be prideful of when it comes to LGBTQIA+ rights.

30 years ago, state legislators voted to prohibit sexual orientation and gender identity discrimination. This made Minnesota the first state in the country to protect the civil rights of LGBTQIA+ community members.

However, a lot has changed since 1993. Now is the time to update sections from the Minnesota Human Rights Act and pass the Take Pride Act.

The Take Pride Act:



Removes the section that says Minnesota does not condone homosexuality and does not recognize the right of same sex marriage. (Minn. Stat. 363A.37)



Updates definitions of sexual orientation and gender identity. (Minn. Stat. 363A.03 Subdivision 44)



Ensures that anyone who has a rental unit available cannot discriminate based on sexual orientation and/or gender identity. (Minn. Stat. 363A.21, Subdivision 1, Paragraph 3)



Ensures all nonprofits that are not religious in nature follow nondiscriminatory laws. (Minn. Stat. 363A.20, Subdivision 3)

Time and time again, Minnesota has chosen love and inclusion to build a thriving and discrimination-free Minnesota.
