



H.F. No. 2433 – Education Supplemental Budget (as proposed to be amended by the A250 delete-everything amendment)

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Section 1. Local anonymous threat reporting system. Provides a cross-reference for data collected through a local anonymous threat reporting system.

Sec. 2. Statewide anonymous threat reporting system. Provides a cross-reference for data collected through the Department of Public Safety's statewide anonymous threat reporting system.

Sec. 3. Anonymous threat reporting system. Requires a school district or charter school to adopt a policy regarding implementation of an anonymous threat reporting system by June 30, 2027, and report certain information to the commissioner. Requires a school district or charter school to implement either a local or statewide anonymous threat reporting system by July 1, 2028. Establishes requirements for a local anonymous threat reporting system. Requires a school district or charter school that does not implement its own system to provide the school community with information about the Department of Public Safety's statewide reporting system. Beginning January 15, 2028, requires an annual report from the Department of Education. Provides for data practices classifications for local and statewide anonymous threat reporting system data. Effective July 1, 2026.

Sec. 4. Compensatory education revenue. Provides that the compensatory revenue for each school site in fiscal year 2027 equals at least 65.9771% of the compensatory revenue for the site in fiscal year 2026, after adjustment for any decline in total enrollment at the site between October 1, 2024, and October 1, 2025. Corrects a cross-reference.

Sec. 5. Building allocation [of compensatory revenue]. Authorizes a school district to allocate up to 40 percent of the district's fiscal year 2028 compensatory revenue to school sites according to a plan adopted by the school board.

Sec. 6. General education aid [appropriation]. Appropriates money from the general fund to the commissioner of education for additional general education aid attributable to the additional compensatory revenue under an earlier section of this article. Adjusts other Laws 2025 general education aid appropriations to conform to the February 2026 forecast. Effective immediately.

Sec. 7. Superseding effect. Provides that the amendment to the Laws 2025 general education aid appropriation in section 6 supersedes and prevails over any other amendment made to that provision during the 2026 Regular Session, regardless of the order of enactment. Effective immediately.

Sec. 8. Appropriations; anonymous threat reporting systems.

Subd. 1. Grants. Appropriates \$4 million in fiscal year 2027 only for grants to schools for the development, purchase, implementation, operation, and maintenance of anonymous threat reporting systems. Authorizes schools to apply to the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management for a grant. Provides for certain grant administration procedures and eligible uses. Requires an annual report to the legislature. Makes the appropriation available until June 30, 2029.

Subd. 2. Statewide threat assessment and investigations. Appropriates \$1 million in fiscal year 2027 only for staffing and operating costs related to threat assessment and investigations. Makes the appropriation available until June 30, 2029.
