



Operating Adjustment

- FY26 \$4.1 million
- FY27 \$6.1 million
- Includes General Fund, Special Revenue and mostly Trunk Highway Funds.

• Grant Administration Authority

- Provide DPS with flexibility to ensure grant funds are properly administered.
- Combat fraud, waste and abuse of public funds.

State Patrol Metro Headquarters Building

- Current building is not secure, nondescript and lacks best practices
- FY26 and FY27 \$48.513 million

• State Patrol Recruitment and Hiring Initiatives

- Seeks to improve recruitment to keep up with attrition
- FY26 and FY27 \$1.045 million
- FY28 and FY29 \$10.365 million

Excessive Speed Penalty Modified

- Excessive speeding is a growing and dangerous problem
- Modification would increase penalties for going more than 35mph over the posted speed limit

Mission

To prevent traffic deaths and serious injuries by changing human behavior in Minnesota through policy development and support, stakeholder engagement, program delivery, leadership, and research and evaluation.





• Planning and Administration Match

- OTS relies on federal funds to accomplish mission and goals. Federal NHTSA funds require a 50% match for these activities.
- Proposal would increase the state match to maximize federal dollars and support the work of the agency.
- FY26 and FY27 \$485,000

Seatbelt Requirement for Class II ATVs

 Class II ATV use on public roads has increased. Crashes have also increased. Requiring seatbelts will prevent serious injury and death when a crash occurs.

Mission

Deliver customer focused driver and vehicle services by optimizing technology and building efficiencies that value employees, support business partners and earn the trust of all Minnesotans.





• No- Fee Transaction Reimbursement to Service Providers

- Provide compensation to Deputy Registrars, Driver's License Agents, and Full-Service Providers for transactions where they complete the work and currently receive no fee.
- FY26 and FY 27 estimated \$2.189 million

• Rulemaking Authority for Ignition Interlock Device Program

- Authorize rulemaking and provide resources to manage and complete rulemaking process.
- FY26 \$457,000
- FY27 \$133,000



STATE OF MINNESOTA

Online Driver's License Renewal

- Allow option to renew Driver's Licenses online once every eight years.
- FY26 and FY27— \$2.074 million

Commercial Learner's Permit Length Extension

• Allow those seeking a CDL to hold their permit for an additional six months. Aligns with federal standards.





• Replace License Plates at Time of Vehicle Transfer

- Require customers to purchase a new plate when purchasing a vehicle. Helps ensure plates on the road are registered to the current owner of the vehicle.
- FY26 \$726,000
- FY27 \$1.452 million

Dealer Plate Changes

• Create some limitation on dealer plates to prevent misuse.

Background Check Expansion for Auto Dealers

• Recommends expanding background checks on applications to become an auto dealer to be full nationwide criminal background checks though the FBI.
