

1.1 Senator ..... moves to amend S.F. No. 4719 as follows:

1.2 Page 2, after line 11, insert:

1.3 "(c) The steering committee must provide monthly updates on the committee's duties  
1.4 under this subdivision to the Legislative Commission on Human Services Systems under  
1.5 section 256.0142."

1.6 Page 2, line 27, after the first "the" insert "Legislative Commission on Human Services  
1.7 Systems under section 256.0142, and to the"

1.8 Page 3, after line 4, insert:

1.9 "Sec. 2. [256.0142] LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION ON HUMAN SERVICES  
1.10 SYSTEMS.

1.11 Subdivision 1. Establishment; duties. (a) The Legislative Commission on Human  
1.12 Services Systems is created to:

1.13 (1) provide oversight and monitoring of the efforts by the counties and the Departments  
1.14 of Human Services; Information Technology Services; and Children, Youth, and Families  
1.15 to manage, develop, update, and modernize information technology systems across human  
1.16 services programs, including, but not limited to: MAXIS, METS, MMIS, SSIS, PRISM,  
1.17 and MEC2;

1.18 (2) evaluate Minnesota's state-supervised, county-administered human services system  
1.19 and provide recommendations for changes, if applicable. This must include evaluating any  
1.20 changes to roles and responsibilities for the administration and delivery of human services  
1.21 programs and services, including program eligibility, case management functions, and use  
1.22 of third-party and nongovernmental entities;

1.23 (3) review how other states procure, administer, and deliver human services programs  
1.24 and services and the information technology infrastructure utilized;

1.25 (4) identify areas within the governance, procurement, and technology structures of the  
1.26 human services system that need to be addressed by the legislature;

1.27 (5) review reports provided to the legislature from state agencies on information  
1.28 technology projects and human services system transformation; and

1.29 (6) review reports and updates provided to the commission by the Human Services  
1.30 Systems Steering Committee under section 256.0141.

2.1 (b) The commission must work with Minnesota's Tribal Nations, counties, and the  
2.2 Departments of Human Services; Information Technology Services; and Children, Youth,  
2.3 and Families to:

2.4 (1) evaluate proposals for any modifications to information technology systems utilized  
2.5 by Minnesota's Tribal Nations, counties, or the Departments of Human Services and Children,  
2.6 Youth, and Families; and

2.7 (2) consider overall costs to the state, counties, and Tribal Nations for the implementation  
2.8 of any systems changes, and assess whether proposed solutions deliver improved services  
2.9 to Minnesotans and administrative responsibilities are efficiently delegated across  
2.10 stakeholders.

2.11 Subd. 2. **Members; meetings.** (a) Members of the legislative commission must include:

2.12 (1) six members from the house of representatives, including three members appointed  
2.13 by the speaker of the house and three members appointed by the minority leader; and

2.14 (2) six members from the senate, including three members appointed by the senate  
2.15 majority leader and three members appointed by the senate minority leader.

2.16 (b) Members of the commission serve a term that expires on December 31 of the  
2.17 even-numbered year following the year they are appointed. The speaker of the house and  
2.18 the majority leader of the senate must each designate a chair and vice-chair from the  
2.19 membership of the commission. The chair and vice-chair must rotate after each meeting.

2.20 (c) The commission must meet at least quarterly.

2.21 Subd. 3. **Administrative support.** The Legislative Coordinating Commission must  
2.22 provide administrative support to the commission and arrange meeting space for commission  
2.23 meetings.

2.24 Subd. 4. **Report.** By February 15, 2027, and annually thereafter, the commission, in  
2.25 cooperation with the commissioners of human services; information technology services;  
2.26 and children, youth, and families, must provide a report to the chairs and ranking minority  
2.27 members of the legislative committees with jurisdiction over human services and children,  
2.28 youth, and families. The report must contain information on the results of the commission's  
2.29 evaluations, identifications, and reviews under subdivision 1; recommendations for any  
2.30 legislative changes; and funding needs to implement any recommended changes.

2.31 Subd. 5. **Expiration.** This commission expires December 31, 2033.

2.32 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment.

3.1       Sec. 3. **LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION ON HUMAN SERVICE SYSTEMS; FIRST**  
3.2 **APPOINTMENTS AND FIRST MEETING.**

3.3       Appointing authorities for the Legislative Commission on Human Service Systems under  
3.4 Minnesota Statutes, section 256.0142, must make first appointments to, and designate the  
3.5 chairs and vice-chairs of, the Legislative Commission on Human Systems by August 15,  
3.6 2026. The member designated as chair by the majority leader of the senate must convene  
3.7 the first meeting of the commission by September 15, 2026."
