

S.F. No. 927 – Transporting Petroleum Product Requirements

Section 1 [Driver requirements] amends the requirements for transporting petroleum products.

Paragraph (a) applies the proposed subdivision to intrastate commerce.

Paragraph (b) requires that drivers, who operate a tank truck vehicle with a capacity of less than 3,500 gallons to transport petroleum products, must have a valid commercial driver's license with endorsements for hazardous materials and tank vehicles and be at least 18 years old.

Paragraph (c) requires that drivers, who operate a vehicle with an overall aggregate capacity of less than 3,500 gallons used to transport liquefied petroleum gases in nonbulk or bulk packages or in consumer storage tanks, must have a valid commercial driver's license with a hazardous materials endorsement and be at least 18 years old.

Paragraph (d) requires drivers transporting liquified petroleum gases to have a tank vehicle endorsement if the aggregate capacity being transported is 1,000 gallons or more and the vehicle has a gross weight of 26,000 pounds.

Section 2 [Repealer] repeals the current law governing the age limit of a driver of a motorized tank truck vehicle.
