



S.F. No. 3623 – Requiring a vehicle approaching a school bus to stop for flashing red lights

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Current law requires a vehicle approaching a school bus to stop at least 20 feet away from the bus when it has extended its stop signal arm and is flashing red lights.

This bill requires a vehicle to stop anytime the school bus is displaying flashing red lights, regardless of whether the stop signal arm is extended.

The bill also adds language stating that flashing amber lights on a school bus serve as notice to any approaching vehicle that the school bus is stopping and will soon exhibit flashing red lights.
